

Practice based research made easy

Searching for a large CBD practice to be involved in the dental implant study, researcher Karen Escobar approached Dr Suzanne Hanlin one day when she was at the Melbourne Dental School. Dr Hanlin readily agreed, resulting in several hundred cases from the practice being made available.

Dr Hanlin's practice manager, Ms Sarah-Jayne Tregilles, met with Wendy Thomson and Karen and worked out how to access the patients' files without causing too much disruption to the practice.


Because of the size of the undertaking and the need for space, this meeting was important. Working through the issues – the number of files, the size of the practice, the demands on staff, access to a computer terminal, and space - a solution was found. And ... it was easy – do the research on the days when Dr Hanlin was not in the surgery. This allowed Wendy and Karen to use Dr Hanlin's room and her computer. Dr Hanlin's staff assisted when necessary.

Before Karen and Wendy started visiting the Collins Street practice, Dr Hanlin gathered information about the implant project and eviDent itself from the network's website – www.evident.net.au – and disseminated it to practice staff so everyone knew what was happening and what the project was.

Karen and Wendy averaged processing about 10 patient cards each a day.

"The practice would have had difficulty in taking part in the project had the researcher not been able to be flexible and work here during the days when Dr Hanlin was not in," Ms Tregilles said.

Dr Hanlin said she was willing to be involved because eviDent and this

study appealed to her on several grounds:

- "It is important to support clinical-based practice research, of which there is too little carried out in Australia;
- The practice should benefit by having patient profiles examined; and,
- It might lead me to be involved in other research".
